President's Desk

Alpha Kappa has been extremely successful in recent years, as illustrated at the 2005 Officer's Leadership conference this past summer in Memphis, TN. Alpha Kappa received its **second** consecutive Smythe, a distinguished honor in itself. In addition, AK was acknowledged for its efforts in

other areas by receiving Campus Involvement, Scholarship, and International Work Day awards. About one month into the semester, we received further news that we were granted **House of the Quarter** honors.

Rush Chairmen Ryan Hiestand and Rob Lichtenberg worked with their team of rush captains to produce a strong, solid pledge class for fall 2005. Pledge educator Dylan Gaisford had the privilege of leading these 20 fine men through their pledgeship this semester.

Special events chairman Ryan Eller and Greek week chairman Ryan Nuef organized the efforts for Greek Week 2005. AK's 100% participation was rewarded throughout the week by placing first in several main events, including show chariot, top 10 list, and overall idi-odysseys. The unbreakable devotion and perseverance paid off when Pi Kappa Alpha, for the first time in four years, was crowned the overall Greek Week winner by an unprecedented 49 points.

David Hill and Kurt Haslag headed the centennial committee and worked tirelessly in preparation for this year's Homecoming, marking Alpha Kappa's 100th anniversary. The Alpha Kappa Educational Foundation announced over \$16,000 in scholastic and leadership scholarships at the Saturday night banquet, attended by over 500

people including international president, Allen Groves, along with national officers, Eddie Scott and Ben Zitek. It was exciting to watch alumni and actives exchange stories, reliving the 100 years of excellence that Alpha Kappa represents.

Pi Kappa Alpha at UMR remains the largest house on campus with 113 men. To manage the size and maintain strong brotherhood, we rented a facility (recently redone by UMR) at 10th and Pine that is capable of housing 39 men. The men at this facility eat at the house and visit regularly. The size has also allowed the Chapter to get their financial house in order. THC Chaz Blaschke strictly enforced the budget and implemented policies to encourage timely payment. Over the next year, we will be working digilenty to reduce the accounts receivable attritributed to alumni and members.

From tutoring children to sending 46 men to a Methodist day camp for the weekend, the men of AK have kept up the tradition of donating time and service to the community. With over 6,000 hours this semester, community service chairman Andrew Arnold has us well on our way to our 12,000 hour goal for the year.

I would also like to thank all alumni for the continued support of our Chapter and its entities. We hope you enjoy the new look of the *Kapers!* Please let us know your thoughts. We look forward to seeing you at Founder's Day.







Featured Article In Shield & Diamond

At the dawn of the 20th century, Albert Einstein was shaking up the scientific community by discovering what would become the basis of three fundamental fields in physics: the theory of relativity, quantum theory and the theory of Brownian motion.

In that same "miraculous year" of 1905, William A. McTighe and Faris T. Walker, two students at the Missouri School of Mines (now UMR), would help chart a course for a new future for the Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity, one that included a chapter above the Mason Dixon Line.

On November 28, 1905, the national Grand Princeps Arthur C. Jones and Grand Treasurer Robert A. Smythe sent W.G. Riddick of Little Rock, Arkansas, to investigate the MSM applicants.

"It was easy enough for me to see of what material they were made," writes Riddick as he describes meeting the eight students. "It has never been my good fortune to meet a finer crowd of men, and certainly I never had a better time than during the first few short days that I spent with them. After the Chapter had been installed, after I changed into only a visiting alumnus, and

there was nothing to do but say 'good-bye' and go back home, I felt like I was leaving my old college and my old Chapter. Don Myers, a 1961 graduate and chair of the chapter's centennial

committee, welcomed 220 alumni, 110 members and pledges, and more than 180 friends and family to the UMR campus on Saturday, October 1, 2005 to celebrate the chapter's 100th anniversary.

The celebration planning officially began at Founders Day in 2003 with a meeting of designated chapter members and interested alumni with a total of 15 attendees. At about the same time a formal agreement was entered into with the author of the Alpha Kappa History. "The history was seen as a significant component of the overall Centennial Celebration," Myers says. "The collective vision of the planning committee was for a fabulous celebration of 100 years of brotherhood specifically for Alpha Kappa and to celebrate brotherhood in general."

The committee reached consensus to have the celebration at the UMR 2005 Homecoming, a general concept of the weekend activities, and the plan for a network of alumni contacting other alumni. This network was to be organized by "decade" coordinators who in turn would work with their "class" coordinators.

"Thanks to excellent work by David Hill, chapter computer guru, a page on the chapter website was devoted to the Centennial Celebration," Myers says. "Information was made available and continuously updated over the two and a half years. Alumni commitment to a 'plan to attend' was requested and encouraged. A list of alumni planning to attend was maintained on the centennial webpage."

Information was also provided in quarterly alumni publications. The challenge was to try to determine

the number of attendees for facility planning. The goal established at the initial meeting was 650.

The weekend entertainment included Friday and Saturday afternoon social hours and house tours, and a two-hour program on Saturday at the Leach Theatre (named for Thomas Leach, Alpha Kappa '15) that took guests back like a time machine through Alpha Kappa's history, beginning with a re-enactment of the fateful 1905 meeting between the founding members and Riddick. That was followed by four more skits depicting specific

decades (50s and 60s, 70s and 80s, 90s and 00s, and vision for the future) and an emotional 21-minute DVD show of pictures set to appropriate background music, developed by graphic artist Angi Yowell, depicting the Alpha Kappa history. The slide show also highlighted the more than 50 years of service to Alpha Kappa by the late Robert V. Wolf '48, professor emeritus of metallurgical engineering at UMR, and long time Alpha Kappa Chapter advisor. Following each skit, five alumni lead the attendees in singing favorite PiKA songs of the particular decades depicted.

The skits included activities that were in many ways unique to the particular decade but to which all alumni could relate. Emphasis was placed on "entertaining" with some liberties taken relative to the facts. The 50s and 60s skit used a favorite party week at that time known as "Bum's Brawl" for a setting to remind alumni of the issues the chapter was facing at that time because of insufficient house capacity.

The 70s and 80s skit used a setting of brothers' early morning attempt to wake a fellow fraternity member using unconventional means in the fraternity house's sleeping guarters. This setting was used to discuss the

various unique aspects of the annual campus St. Pat's celebration, and the scholarship dinner where individuals with high academic achievement for the semester ate steak and the others ate beans.

The 90s skit was focused on the 1999 fire that destroyed the chapter house and took the life of Brother Jered N. Adams '97, along with the rebuilding and dedication of the new house. This slide presentation was narrated by Brother Ryan Stockamp '98, who was the first to discover the fire.

The final skit used a setting of the biannual officer and alumni organization directors retreat to discuss the issues related to the vision of the future for Alpha Kappa. PiKA International President Allen W. Groves (Stetson, Delta Upsilon '79) dropped in on the meeting (skit) to share the vision of International.

The celebration continued from the program directly to the Grand Centennial Banquet held at the recently finished Havener Center on campus. The affair included a welcome address from each of the four Alpha Kappa entities, recognition of individuals, comments by International President Groves, and the distribution of \$16,000 in awards to undergraduate members in the areas of academic achievement, leadership, and rush.

The celebration also included the unveiling of a 300-page book on the chapter's history. Each alumnus will receive a copy of the book, titled A History of the Alpha Kappa Chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha 1905-2005: 100 Years of Brotherhood. "Through Melody Lloyd's writing and research skills, she was able to reassemble our past through words and pictures. She worked directly with International Headquarters, the UMR archives, the MSM-

UMR Alumni Association, and many AK alumni to locate much of our history lost in the tragic fire of 1999. The book truly covers our chapter's interesting history," commented the Alpha Kappa project leader Richard Bauer '48. Researchers on this book included Bauer, Myers, Dale Spence, and Keith Wedge.

"Alpha Kappa alumni treasure their belief in the Fraternity's preamble and are determined to maintain and enhance brotherhood for all present and future brothers," Myers says. "Alpha Kappa takes great satisfaction from recognitions by and contributions to the international efforts in the past 100 years."

Alpha Kappa and its members have received 14 Smythe awards (including 2004 and 2005), four Powers Awards, and Chapter House of the Year in 2003. It has had three national/international vice presidents, one national rush director, and four district presidents.

Alpha Kappa has recently celebrated the addition of two new entities: The Alpha Kappa Educational Foundation, which received IRS approval in 2003, and the Alpha Kappa Alumni Association which received its charter at the 2004 International Convention in St. Louis, Missouri. Since Founders Day 2003, the combined effort of the alumni entities has awarded almost \$100,000 in scholarships to undergraduate members in the areas of scholarship, leadership, community service, campus involvement and rush.

The chapter has grown to over 100 members and pledges total, a size that enables it to successfully compete in all phases of campus life. The management focus of the chapter has indeed shifted because of the difficulties associated with maintaining brotherhood when housed in various locations, as compared to under one roof. The biannual officer transition retreats have helped plan and navigate this new environment.

"The four entities – Active Chapter, Alpha Kappa House Corporation, Alpha Kappa Alumni Association and Alpha Kappa Educational Foundation – now all work in concert to assure Alpha Kappa's success in the future," Bauer adds.

Annual Housing Renewal

In keeping with the original strategy of replacing carpet every five years when the House was constructed, the House Corporation replaced all the carpets this summer. In addition the usual painting, repairing, cleaning, and waxing was completed to put the house back like new. The House Corporation continues its commitment to insure the houses continued beauty. The commitment represents a significant investment each year but the returns are also significant in various ways including assistance in rush and maintaining a healthy pride in the house by the Chapter.
